I would like to make the following Additional Grounds Comments about my trial in September 2007 as follows:

(a). I unequivocally deny the premise by the Court in Vancouver, WA that the reason I was hospitalized during my trial was due to a suicide attempt by some drug overdose. Even the Army, my former Employer has backed away from that argument. Here is why: In late Summer of 2006, when I was informed that I was under investigation by my Military chain of Command at Portland Army Recruiting Station, I made a conscious decision to call the Sheriff's office in Vancouver, WA to turn-in my personal weapon, a .45 caliber Pistol, Rossi, silver plated. The Sheriff's came by my house and I handed them my gun without being asked.

- (b). Prior to my trial and through more than 24 years in the Army, I have never attempted suicide for any reason.
- (c). During my trial in September 2007, I showed-up for my trial every day, until my health deteriorated and I passed-out in my Apartment, where I was found by the Police and Paramedics.
- (d). No suicide notes were found on me or in my Apartment.
- (e). I was found, fully dressed in my Military Uniform apparently ready for court that day, not death.
- (f). If I intended to die or commit suicide why turn-in my pistol to the Sheriff's Dept months prior, why waste my time taking a shower, ironing my military uniform and getting dressed before attempting suicide when my trial was still on going and no one knew which way

the jury will lean before closing arguments.

The premise that I would attempt suicide before a verdict is reached is utterly ridiculous and without merit.

(9). Another theory out there is that I called the Ambulance after I ingested a number of pills. Well, the records show that when the Police and Paramedics arrived at my Apartment, in September 2007, I was unconscious and did not regain consciousness until late Dec 07, three and half months later. However, in late Dec 07, when I regained consciousness, I asked my Attorney, Mr Robert Vukanovich if he could bring my cell phones to me at the Hospital, he returned a few days later and informed me that he could not locate either of my phones - no phones in my Apartment.

Even several months after this incident, while all my property was being moved into storage, my Estate Manager, Mr Steve Broom could not locate any of my phones. So that puts to rest the phone call theory.

Note that I have not re-entered my Apartment since being hospitalized in September 2007.

I did not have a regular house phone in my Apartment, so I could not have made the call to the 911 Operator or Hospital as claimed.

Finally, because of my Medical Condition, ie, Seizure, Coma and brain damage, I did not have the opportunity to present my case to the jury but now that I am recovering, I will like to exercise that right or privilege.


Based on the information that I have provided here and the Appeal brief that was filed by


