Case Summary: Glen Cathers, a registered sex offender, left his residence for 12 days without informing his county sheriff, or law enforcement in the location where he traveled, where he would be staying. Based upon this failure to notify, the State charged Mr. Cathers with failure to register as a sex offender, contending that Mr. Cathers ceased to have a "fixed residence" as defined by statute, triggering a renewed duty to register. The trial court found Mr. Cathers guilty. Mr. Cathers appeals.
