Case Name: Daniel Nelson v. Spokane Community College

County: Spokane

Case Summary: Spokane Community College dismissed Daniel Nelson from the college's nursing program following his admission to plagiarism. Mr. Nelson appeals the discipline, claiming violations of Washington's Administrative Procedures Act, ch. 34.05, RCW, and violations of constitutional due process protections.

Case Name: Evans v. Spokane County

County: Spokane

Case Summary: Carlton Evans sustained severe, life-altering injuries, when a tree fell on his car during a heavy windstorm. Spokane County owned the road and maintained the land where the tree was located. Mr. Evans and his wife sued the County for negligently maintaining both the tree and the road. A jury entered a defense verdict for the County. The Evanses appeal, arguing the lower court erred by dismissing one of their legal theories on summary judgment, by giving erroneous jury instructions, and for limiting and excluding testimony from their expert witnesses. The County conditionally cross-appeals the trial court's decision to give, and refusal to give, other contested instructions.
