Case Summary: A jury convicted Douglas Arbogast of sex offenses stemming from a "Net Nanny" operation. Mr. Arbogast appeals the denial of his entrapment defense, and alternatively requests dismissal on similar grounds.

Case Name: City of Selah v. Steven and Janet Owens

County: Yakima

Case Summary: The City of Selah initiated this lawsuit against the Owenses after determining that property owned by them violated provisions of the Selah Municipal Code. On summary judgment, the Yakima County Superior Court found the property to

be in violation of local ordinances, declared it a nuisance, and issued an order of abatement. The Owenses appeal, arguing that the Land Use Petition Act should have governed the action, that the City's action violated the City's municipal code, that genuine issues of material fact existed that should have precluded summary judgment, and that the superior court erred by ignoring a purported settlement agreement between the parties.
