1) No.: 37336-3-III Case Name: Jason Sleater v. Richard Griffith, et ux. County: Spokane

Case Summary: Jason Sleater was injured when he fell into a ditch on property being developed by Peck & Peck Excavation Co. and other defendants. The superior court dismissed the claim against Peck on summary judgment, finding that Peck did not breach the minimal duty of care owed to trespassers. The court also denied Mr. Sleater's motion to continue summary judgment. Mr. Sleater appeals, urging adoption of the private necessity privilege applicable to trespassers as described in the Restatement (Second) of Torts, and also appeals the denial of his motion to continue.

2) No.: 37414-9-III Case Name: White Water Construction, Inc. v. Employment Sec. Dep't County: Spokane

Case Summary: The Employment Security Department awarded Fred Stevens unemployment benefits following his termination from White Water Construction. The superior court reversed the Department's order and instead found Mr. Stevens ineligible for benefits because he was terminated for misconduct and because he was not able to work and available for work based upon his receipt of workers' compensation benefits. The Department appeals on Mr. Stevens's behalf.
