THIRD AMENDED  
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER  
NO.20-002  
ARRESTS FOR GROSS  
MISDEMEANOR AND  
MISDEMEANOR OFFENSES.

WHEREAS, the governor of the State of Washington has declared a state of emergency in all counties due to the public health emergency caused by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Supreme Court has adopted Third Revised and Extended Order Regarding Operations No. 25700-B-625, granting emergency authority to Benton County District Court to adopt, modify, and suspend court rules and orders, and to take further actions concerning court operations, as warranted to address the current state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, Benton County has declared an emergency in response to COVID-19,  
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, until further notice and effective Wednesday, June 3, 2020:

1. All defendants arrested/cited for misdemeanor and gross misdemeanor crimes, except for Domestic Violence crimes and DUI/Physical Control crimes, will be set for court dates after June 3, 2020, and released on their personal recognizance.
2. Any outstanding bench warrants on misdemeanor and gross misdemeanor crimes, except for Domestic Violence crimes and DUI/Physical Control crimes, shall not be served on defendants until after June 3, 2020.
3. Defendants arrested/cited for misdemeanor and gross misdemeanor crimes or who have outstanding bench warrants on misdemeanor or gross misdemeanor crimes who present a risk to community safety may be booked into the Benton County Jail. The Benton County Jail Supervisor or a Benton County District Court Judge has the authority to determine that a defendant presents a risk to community safety that requires the defendant to be booked.

This emergency order does not impact Domestic Violence crimes and DUI/Physical Control crimes.
