WHEREAS, after Administrative Order 2020-1D was entered, both Washington Supreme Court and the Grays Harbor County Superior Court entered orders restricting in-person hearings and public access to court facilities;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED;

- 1. All pending civil and out-of-custody criminal cases except civil protection orders will be continued until after May 6, 2020. Department 1 and Department 2 will be closed to other public access until May 6, 2020.
- 2. All in-custody criminal cases will be continued until after May 6, 2020 with the exception stated in paragraph 7 of Supreme Court Order #25700-B-607.
- 3. All out-of-custody criminal cases filed between now and May 6, 2020 shall have the first appearance scheduled at least 45 days after the filing of the charge.
- 4. In criminal cases, the time between March 16, 2020 (the date of this court's first COVID-19 order) and the next scheduled trial date will be an excluded period for the purposes of CrRLJ 3.3.
- 5. In infraction cases, the time between March 16, 2020 and the next scheduled court date will be an excluded period when computing time under IRLJ 2.6.
- 6. In protection order cases filed after the date of this order, the full order hearing will be held in Department 1 in Montesano.

- 7. Nothing in this order precludes matters being handled by mail or in other ways that do not involve an in-person appearance before the court.
- 8. This order will be reviewed prior to May 6, 2020.
