THIS ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER is being issued in response to the current pandemic outbreak of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

Given the significant number of identified and projected cases of the disease in Washington, the severity of the risk posed to the public, the recommendations of the Health District, and the authority granted by Supreme Court Order No. 25700-B-626 (May 29, 2020), additional action by the local Courts is required.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby:

All speedy trial calculations shall be based on the Supreme Court Order(s) no trial shall be heard prior to July 6, 2020. The time between 05/29/2020 and 09/01/2020 shall be excluded when calculating time for trial. Any out of custody criminal arraignments filed between 03/18/2020 and 07/03/2020 may be deferred until a date 45 days after filing; the new arraignment date shall be considered the "initial commencement date" for establishing time for trial.

On June 1, 2020, the Shelton Municipal Court expects to reopen physically to the public. Masks or similar covering for the face's mouth and nose area shall be required of everyone entering the Civic Center for Court. Anyone that is ill shall be denied entry and shall contact their attorney and/or the Court staff by telephone to inform of the situation. Anyone without face covering shall be denied entry if they refuse to cover (Court will supply bandana type covering if needed). Memorandum of 05/29/2020 is incorporated into this Order.

Social distancing, per Health Department guidelines, shall be required at all times, additional space will be set up by the Court to accommodate said requirement. Violations of social distancing and facial covering requirements shall cause immediate removal from Civic Center and Court by security.
