GENERAL ORDER NO. 2020-09 (REVISING ORDER NO 2020-03)

WHEREAS On February 29, 2020, Washington State Governor Jay Inslee declared a state of emergency due to the public health emergency posed by the spread of the coronavirus (COVID – 19).

WHEREAS on March 4, 2020 Chief Justice Debra Stephens of the Washington State Supreme Court adopted Order No. 25700-B-602, granting emergency authority to the Presiding Judges of Washington courts to adopt, modify, and/or suspend court rules and orders, and to take further actions concerning court operations, as warranted to address the current public health emergency; and

WHEREAS the Governor has issued a proclamation closing all restaurants, bars, entertainment and recreational centers, among many other businesses, which may

cause many of our defendants to lose employment and out of respect for the economic hardship the current public health emergency has created; and

WHEREAS Pierce County is currently in Phase 2 of the Safe Start plan, which allows restaurants to operate at no more than 50% capacity, and a number of other businesses are not yet allowed to open; and

WHEREAS on June 1, 2020 this Court signed General Order 2020-08, which authorized ongoing virtual hearings and postponed jury trials to begin as of August 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS the court is aware of the economic hardship of many citizens due to the COVID-19 pandemic. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that

- 1) Effective Tuesday, March 17, 2020, all due dates for any payments due to the court are extended until September 1, 2020.
 - 2) No referrals to collections for past due payments until September 1, 2020. Dated this 26th day of June, 2020.
