On 16 March 2020, the Mayor of the City of Lynnwood closed all public buildings under her control in response to the present public-health emergency.

In response to the evolving emergency, the Court modifies its Order 2020-01 of 12 March 2020 as follows:

The Court remains open in the sense that the clerks and probation officers will be at work, answering the telephone, responding to electronic and physical mail, posting payments, and conducting the other administrative business of the Court.

The Court will be closed to the public in the sense that the front counter will no longer be staffed to speak with customers nor to receive documents or payments hand-to-hand. Customers are invited to use the telephone or e-mail to contact the Clerk's Office and to make payments on-line.

The courtroom will open briefly every morning to accommodate persons arrested for DUI/Physical Control or Domestic Violence who were given an order by the police to report to the court at 0800 in order to set conditions for their further release.


Hearings to prove the surrender of firearms, the installation of an ignition interlock device or the installation of an alcohol-sensing device on one's person will be set to 0800, as well.

In-custody hearings for prisoners in the City Jail or SCORE will be conducted over the video link at 0800 and 0900 respectively.

The courtroom will be closed for the remainder of every day all other purposes.

This emergency order becomes effective at the start of business on Tuesday, 17 March 2020. It remains in effect until further order of the Court.
