WHEREAS, a public emergency exists regarding Covid 19 pandemic, and the Court needs to comply with Governor Inslee's Emergency Order of February 29, 2020 and City of Marysville Covid 19 policy, and

AND WHEREAS, the Washington State Supreme Court has issued Emergency Order 25700-B-606 and Order 25700-B-607 with the purpose and intent of providing a uniform approach for Courts to maintain consistent and equitable access to justice

AND WHEREAS, this Court's Emergency Administrative Order 2020-03, and 2020-04 need to be modified to conform to Washington State Supreme Court Order 25700-B-606 and order 25700-B-607,


NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED

Effective immediately, new procedures under Supreme Court Emergency Administrative Order 25700-B-606 shall be in effect for the Marysville Municipal Court. This Order shall apply to all persons transacting business with the Marysville Municipal Court and shall include, but are not limited to, attorneys, parties, witnesses and jurors.

- 1) All cases are hereby be continued until after Friday, April 24, 2020. Pursuant to Supreme Court Order, the new commencement date shall be April 25, 2020
- 2) The court will continue to hear in-custody cases daily, including first appearances, arraignments, plea hearings, pre-trial release motions, bail modification motions. Priority shall be assigned to pretrial release hearings and plea hearings.
- 3) All emergency matters shall be heard by telephone, video or other means to avoid in-person contact and promote social distancing
- 4) Attorney's access to Jails may be limited during this pandemic, for policy reasons beyond the Courts control. The Court will work with Jail staff and City staff to assure that Defendants held

at Jail on Marysville cases will have access to legal counsel. The access of attorneys may be through forms of video, web portal, phone or other means. The Court reserves the right to modify or change policy based upon reports of the effectiveness of these measures.
