## IN THE MUNICIPAL COURT FOR THE CITY OF LYNDEN WHATCOM COUNTY, WASHINGTON

IN THE MATTER OF THE RESPONSE BY WASHINGTON STATE COURTS TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY IN WASHINGTON STATE TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER .

NO. 2020-02

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has determined the spread of the new coronavirus has now reached worldwide pandemic levels; and

WHEREAS, people within Washington State and Whatcom County have been diagnosed with COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Supreme Court has adopted Order No. 25700-B-618, granting emergency authority to this court to adopt, modify, and suspend court rules and orders, and to take further actions concerning court operations, as warranted to address the current state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, the calling together of prospective jurors and the jury selection process necessarily requires exposure of large groups of people which is a medically contraindicated activity under the current state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, there are no criminal jury trials currently scheduled in Lynden Municipal Court (several jury trials have previously postponed); and

TEMPORARY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER-1

WHEREAS, the Court is committed to protecting the health and safety of our local community as well as anyone who sets foot in our courtroom, while at the same time protecting the constitutional rights of defendants.

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. <u>Reopening of Wednesday Court Sessions</u> Lynden Municipal Court is scheduled to reopen on Wednesday, June 10, 2020.

2. <u>Jury Trials</u> Jury trials shall be postponed until July 29, 2020, or a later date if deemed necessary to address the threat to public health.

3. <u>Agreed Continuances</u> There is no need for the attorney nor their client/defendant to come to court just for a continuance. The Court will accept a written, agreed order stipulating to good cause related to the COVID-19 pandemic, without the need for the defendant's signature. Attached is a sample Order of Continuance.

4. <u>Illness Alert</u> All persons are instructed not to come to court if they are sick. Attorneys shall instruct their clients of this safety measure. Further, a notice to this effect shall be posted on the Court's webpage to instruct anyone who is ill on a scheduled court date to contact the Court to reschedule. No person shall be permitted to enter the courtroom if they are exhibiting signs of illness. Any person sneezing or coughing shall be denied entry or asked to leave and reschedule.

5. <u>Police Security and Distancing Outside the Courtroom</u> The Lynden Police Department will assist by limiting access to the courtroom and directing "overflow" defendants to a designated area outdoors where social distancing can be observed or have defendants wait in their cars. Public defender cases will be staggered in the afternoon to help avoid overflow.

6. <u>Social/Physical Distancing and Protective Masks</u> Lynden Public Works (Maintenance) shall clean and prepare the courtroom in advance of reopening and remove some of the courtroom chairs to an adjacent room so that the remaining chairs in the courtroom are at least six feet apart. All who attend court are strongly urged to wear protective masks in the courtroom and in the vicinity of the building. Masks will be provided to persons who do not bring their own. 7. <u>In Custody Defendants</u> In custody defendants may continue to be seen at the downtown jail and jail alternatives center with routine safety measures in place. We shall continue to utilize phone conferencing and prepare orders to be faxed to the jail for delivery to a defendant as needed.

8. <u>Infractions</u> Pro se litigants are encouraged to submit written requests to mitigate infractions or, if they qualify, enter a deferred finding by mail. The Court will inform pro se litigants of its decision without oral argument or a hearing.

9. <u>Future Orders</u> This Order may be amended or withdrawn to address the on-going public health emergency.
