### **Call to Order**

Justice Bridge called the meeting to order at 10:20 a.m.

Mr. Johnson requested several changes to the RMAC report in the minutes of the October 27 meeting. The modified minutes were approved.

### **Old Business**

### **Budget Status**

Dr. Clarke presented a handout on Digital Justice Cost Savings and solicited comments.

Justice Bridge reported on the Executive Committee budget meeting held earlier in the morning, at which the new legislative liaison and budget director for OAC, Victor Moore, reported that the state budget for the new biennium will be very tight. Justice Bridge encouraged members to begin thinking about prioritizing the requested JIS decision packages.

### **Data Dissemination Policy Revision**

Judge Grosse reported on the access to family law court records issue. He asked members to approve the policy, so it can be forwarded to the Supreme Court for consideration.

## MOTION: A motion was made to accept the revisions to the policy. It was seconded and approved by voice vote.

Justice Bridge thanked Kathy Kuriyama, Mark Weiss and Diana Kramer for their hard work.

### **New Business**

### Internet Access Charge for JIS-Link

Mr. Backus reported on the issue of subscriber access to an Internet version of JIS-Link. He presented several different options for making JIS data available on the OAC website.

### Local web reuse of JIS data

Mr. Backus reported on the issue of trial courts and county clerks posting JIS data on their local websites. Doing so raises both subscription and data dissemination policy questions. Court calendaring information constitutes the most immediate example.

# MOTION: Judge Grosse moved that both issues be tabled for further discussion. He noted the statutory basis for public access and associated access fees.

### Electronic filing upload standard

Dr. Clarke reported multiple requests for electronic filing data uploads. He recommended the establishment of a statewide superior court e-filing upload standard before proceeding on any of these requests.

# MOTION: A motion was approved to establish an e-filing standard prior to beginning work on any requested uploads to SCOMIS.

### **Committee/Subcommittee Reports**

### RMAC

Mr. Johnson reported that the committee will concentrate on records associated with electronic cases, dealing with recorder notes and reviewing retention schedules next year.

As there were no further issues to discuss, the JISC meeting adjourned at 11:00 a.m.
