

Inslee, lawmakers set to meet to discuss court sanctions

Gov. Jay Inslee is set to meet with legislative leaders on Monday to discuss how to address the Supreme Court sanctions announced last week over education funding.

SEATAC, Wash. (AP) — Gov. Jay Inslee is set to meet with legislative leaders on Monday to discuss how to address the Supreme Court sanctions announced last week over education funding.

They are holding a private meeting at SeaTac City Hall Monday afternoon to discuss the latest development in the McCleary education funding lawsuit. Then the governor is set to talk with reporters.

Last Thursday, a unanimous court said the state would be sanctioned \$100,000 a day, until the state comes into compliance with the court's requirement for a full plan on education funding. The money will be put into a dedicated education account.

The Washington Supreme Court ruled in 2012 the state is failing to meet its constitutional duty to pay for the full cost of basic education for its 1 million schoolchildren.
