I think all Technicians should be licensed as such in family law ONLY if they take family law courses before becoming licensed and maintain the license by required courses on a continuing basis for so long as they act as family law technicians. For example, I recently was involved with an issue involving family law that not even many attorneys are familiar with: An American who sponsors an immigrant as one's spouse must sign a Support Affidavit; if a divorce is commenced within the first 10 years of marriage, the Sponsor must pay, per federal law, spousal support of 125% of the minimum poverty level for 10 years. Such courses should consider issues such as this given the great number of immigrant spouses in America today.
