There are many attorneys who do mostly to nothing but public indigent defense on a contract basis or on a continuing conflict panel basis. Many of those attorneys get by just fine without renting formal office space -- they can talk with clients on cell phones, get their mail via PO Boxes or postal mail boxes, and if they absolutely have to meet clients in person for extended periods of time they can usually find some place to meet in private such as a meeting room at the court house or in a library. These attorneys generally aren't making a killing doing public defense so they can't always afford to rent even small office spaces when doing so could cost them several hundred dollars each month.
