

**This message is on behalf of AOC MSD Director Ramsey Radwan and is the seventh notice to JIS LINK users and Public Index subscribers about upcoming changes involving King County Clerk's Office and King County District Court cases in JIS.**

The King County Superior Court Clerk's Office (KCCO) has migrated to a new case management system, KC SCRIPT. This has been a complex, multi-phased project, beginning with KCCO's migration from SCOMIS to KC SCRIPT. Following the migration to KC SCRIPT, limited King County Superior Court cases will be available on JIS Link and in Public Index files.

If you use JISLink, SCOMIS, or Public Index subscriptions to get information about King County Superior Court cases, this migration will affect you. Since the implementation of KC SCRIPT, KCCO has continued to add well-identified person cases to SCOMIS. Updates to both systems have included: adult criminal and juvenile offender cases, protection orders, family law matters, dependency, termination, and other juvenile related matters. However, not all case details have been entered into SCOMIS, and will not be available in JIS Link or Public Index files.

In order to obtain a statewide view of case and person information during the migration project, JIS Link and Public Index subscribers will need to look in both JIS Link and King County's Public Portal <https://kingcounty.gov/courts/clerk/access-records/records-portal.aspx>

AOC is implementing a modernized version of JIS Link. This web-based user interface will be capable of displaying information from the Judicial Information System and local case management systems when they are fully integrated. AOC will provide more information about the new JISLink UI in the coming weeks.
