RE: STOP Grant to the Courts

At the direction of the Board for Judicial Administration, the Gender and Justice Commission is administering the Office on Violence Against Women STOP Grant to the Courts. We have \$112,519.00 in federal grant funding for local court projects to provide increased safety and justice for adult victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking. Applications are due on Thursday, January 15, 2009.

We invite you to review the Request for Proposal (RFP) 09-10, and the attached list of projects funded in the past four years. To date, we have funded 54 court projects, provided training at eight state judicial conferences, and provided scholarships for over 140 judicial officers to attend national domestic violence training.

Many of the projects funded by the grant were designed so they could be used by other courts. Details of those projects are available for your review upon request. We welcome your proposal to replicate one of the projects, as well as proposals for new and innovative projects.
