

Her work in probation started with an internship in college; she'd planned to test for law enforcement, but found she loved working in probation so much, she never left. Melanie has been the Probation Officer for Issaquah Municipal Court since June 2012 and has now worked in the court community for 22 years.

Many members of the MPA are excited about the CLJ-CMS Project finally being implemented. Melanie shares the MPA's eagerness for a new system. "Probation departments have always maintained independent databases, so sharing of information has been difficult. With a statewide system, it will be much easier to share information and better serve our courts and the community. There are many MPA members that have worked for years to get a statewide system in place, so it is exciting to be included in this project and see it come together." As a member of the PSC, she wants the CLJ community to be aware that "the Committee has worked diligently to include all levels and types of CLJ's when making decisions on this project, in order to provide a product that brings courts together statewide, while still meeting individual court needs." As a user of Tyler Supervision (formerly CaseloadPRO), she is excited for departments statewide to utilize and connect with this case management system.

Some of the most rewarding moments in her work happen when past probationers stop by or call her, "sometimes even well after their case is closed, to let me know how well they are doing and things they have accomplished since completing supervision." She recalls a particularly memorable interaction – "After a rocky start, a probationer of mine graduated successfully several years ago. She still comes in to give updates and check-in. She finished her GED, went on to take college classes, and has been in the process of becoming a certified vet tech." Connecting with probationers and sharing in their continued success helps Melanie to keep her passion for working with defendants to leave what can be a revolving door of the criminal justice system. She has recently also been involved with her court's new Community Court that started in August 2021 and is excited to work with participants in a different type of court environment.

On a personal note, Melanie is a proud mom to a very active and amazing eight-year old, Carter, and she is looking forward to spending more time with her wonderful family both in the US and across the pond in England. She loves to travel with her family, and they are looking forward to resuming their adventures soon. Melanie is also serious about her love of hiking; she previously trained to hike Mt. Rainier for a fundraiser, but COVID has pushed to a new goal of 2022!
