Modern Technology

The term "SC-CMS" is short for "Superior Court Case Management System." This project is intended to acquire and implement a centrally hosted commercial off-the-shelf case management system.

Partnership

In July 2013, in partnership with superior court and county clerk representatives, following a full procurement process, the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) entered into a multi-year contract to implement **Tyler Technologies' Odyssey** Case Management System.


Implementation

The pilot site – Lewis County – went live with Odyssey in June 2015. Three early adopter counties – Franklin, Thurston, and Yakima – followed in November 2015.


The 2016 Odyssey rollout includes Snohomish County (May) and Asotin, Columbia, Garfield, Spokane, and Whitman Counties (October). The remaining twenty-seven counties across the state will be implemented in three groups starting in May 2017. The statewide implementation is expected to be complete in 2018.

Benefits

The current Superior Court Management Information System (SCOMIS) was developed in 1977.



Business needs and technology have evolved considerably in the past four decades. SCOMIS is difficult to change, costly to maintain, and has limited ability to integrate with newer applications.



Odyssey will enhance the ability to:

- Direct and monitor court case progress;
- Schedule case events;
- Enforce court business rules;
- View case schedules, status, progress, and case party information;
- Communicate court schedules and orders; and
- Leverage technology for new efficiencies.
