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## SENATE BILL 5745

- AN ACT Relating to implementing Becca task force truancy reform recommendations; amending RCW 28A.225.005, 28A.225.020, 28A.225.030, 28A.225.035, and 28A.225.090; adding a new section to chapter 28A.225 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 20 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28A.225.020 and 2009 c 266 s 1 are each amended to 21 read as follows:
  - (1) If a child required to attend school under RCW 28A.225.010 fails to attend school without valid justification, the public school in which the child is enrolled shall:
  - (a) Inform the child's ((custodial)) parent((, parents, or guardian)) by a notice in writing or by telephone whenever the child has failed to attend school after one unexcused absence within any month during the current school year. School officials shall inform the parent of the potential consequences of additional unexcused absences. If the ((custodial)) parent((, parents, or guardian)) is not fluent in English, the ((preferred practice is to)) school must provide this information in a language in which the ((custodial)) parent((, parents, or guardian)) is fluent;
  - (b) Schedule a conference or conferences with the ((custodial)) parent((, parents, or guardian)) and child at a time reasonably convenient for all persons included for the purpose of analyzing the causes of the child's absences after two unexcused absences within any month during the current school year. If a regularly scheduled parent-teacher conference day is to take place within thirty days of

- 3 (c) Take <u>data-informed</u> steps to eliminate or reduce the child's absences. These steps shall include <u>a risk and needs assessment using</u> a validated truancy assessment tool, if available, to identify areas

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(2) ((For purposes of this chapter, an)) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

in a language in which the parent is fluent, of the steps to be taken

- (a) "Truancy assessment tool" means a reliable and validated 23 24 assessment instrument designed to measure the risk and needs of a student in each of the following domains: Aggression-defiance; 25 depression-anxiety; substance abuse; peer deviance; family 26 27 environment; and school engagement, for the purpose of assessing 28 needs and risk related to academic performance and attendance, providing the information can be used in responding to risk and 29 30 needs, for selecting appropriate interventions and case management.
  - (b) "Unexcused absence" means that a child:

to eliminate or reduce the child's absence.

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- $((\frac{(a)}{(a)}))$  <u>(i)</u> Has failed to attend the majority of hours or periods in an average school day or has failed to comply with a more restrictive school district policy; and
  - $((\frac{b}{b}))$  <u>(ii)</u> Has failed to meet the school district's policy for excused absences.
  - (3) If a child transfers from one school district to another during the school year, the receiving school or school district shall include the unexcused absences accumulated at the previous school or from the previous school district for purposes of this section, RCW

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1 7.21.030(2)(e), or may impose alternatives to detention such as truancy assessment as required under subsection (i)(c) of this 2 section, history of any best practices or researched-based 3 intervention previously provided to the child by the child's current 4 school district, and a copy of the most dated truancy information 5 6 inclusive of online or written acknowledgment by the parent and child, as provided for in RCW 28A.225.005. 7 (4) Subject to the availability of funds, the administrative 8 9 office of the courts must complete validation of the Washington 10 assessment of risk and needs of students for high school students not 11 later than August 30, 2015, develop and validate Washington assessments of risk and needs for middle school and elementary school 12 students not later than August 30, 2016, and report the status of the 13 14 tool development and validation by January 1st of each calendar year 15 until development and validation are complete.

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
