- **RE:** Summary of Changes for Designated Crisis Responder, Involuntary Civil Commitment Order, and Joel's Law forms, based on Laws of 2024, Ch. 209.

The Involuntary Civil Commitment Pattern Forms Subcommittee created five (5) new forms to comply with the legislative mandate in <u>ESHB 1877</u>. The Subcommittee consulted with the Health Care Authority to determine what forms are necessary for use by DCRs, in general. As these forms are not mandatory use forms, the Subcommittee decided to keep the forms simpler, allowing jurisdictions to edit them as necessary to comply with varying jurisdictional procedures. Additionally, the subcommittee made minor changes to three (3) other civil behavioral health forms, as outlined, based on legislative changes.
