ML 97 Merit System Increments

The Washington State Law Library (Law Library) requests funding to continue providing merit increases for eligible employees. (General Fund-State)

PL AA Restore Core Law Library Collection

The Washington State Law Library (Library) requests \$199,000 additional, ongoing base funding for the Library's collection. Three decades of high inflation in legal publishing have eroded the Library's ability to purchase the core titles needed by our patrons. The internet provides some free access to primary law (cases, statutes, and regulations), but not the treatises needed for understanding the law. These treatises are heavily used by judges and staff attorneys in the judicial, executive, and legislative branches, as well as private attorneys and the general public. This increase will restore on-going access to these critical titles. (General Fund-State)

PL AB Merge Law Library into Sup Court

The Washington State Law Library (Library) and Washington State Supreme Court (Court) jointly request that the merger of the Library into the Court begun in 1959, be finally completed by transferring the remaining expenditure authority on an ongoing basis from the Library to the Court. When the Library was merged into the Court in 1959, the transfer of finances was deemed to be a one-time event, which doesn't seem to match the intent of the bill. This request completes the merger intended by the 1959 Legislature. (General Fund-State)
