Case Name: Williams v. Amer. Traffic Solutions, Inc. and City of Spokane
County: Spokane

Case Summary: Chris Williams received a traffic infraction for speeding in a school zone based on evidence from an automated traffic enforcement camera. Mr. Williams paid the ticket in municipal court. He later sued the issuing jurisdiction and its photo enforcement contractor in superior court for unjust enrichment and to declare the school zone invalid. This Court accepted interlocutory review to determine whether lack of subject matter jurisdiction, res judicata, or other matters bar Mr. Williams's lawsuit.
