In determining whether a duty exists, this Court assesses "mixed considerations of logic, common sense, justice, policy, and precedent." Stalter v. State, 151 Wn.2d 148, 155, 86 P.3d 1159 (2004). In this broad-ranging inquiry, the question of duty "is to be answered generally, without reference to the facts or parties in a particular case in part by taking note of 'legislative facts'—social, economic, and scientific facts that simply supply premises in the process of legal reasoning." Estate of Templeton v. Daffern, 98 Wn. App. 677, 687, 990 P.3d 968 (2000) (cleaned Appellate courts take judicial notice under ER 201 of legislative facts of the sort provided in this submission, i.e. social facts. Wyman v. Wallace, 94 Wn.2d 99, 102-03, 615 P.2d 452 (1980); Center for Biological Diversity v. Dep't of Fish & Wildlife, 14 Wn. App. 2d 945, 963, 474 P.3d 1107 (2020).

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WSU fraternity shut down until 2030 for hazing, school says

Washington State University shut down one of its fraternities last month for hazing, according to WSU's website.

Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity, 710 NE Linden St., in the school's Greek Row in Pullman, will no longer be recognized on campus until May 2030.

WSU's website reported the fraternity coerced new members to use drugs and alcohol, forced them to complete physical activities for "poor performance," were punished with cleaning duties for not "meeting expectations" and created a power imbalance between the younger members and the older, initiated members.

The investigation found the fraternity responsible for violating the student organization policy through hazing, reckless endangerment, alcohol, drugs and physical harm or threat in the past two years.

When the fraternity can re-assume their status on campus in five years, they must be alcohol free until 2032, the website said.

As a result, Alpha Sigma Phi has lost its recognition until May 2030. Upon re-recognition, the chapter will be alcohol-free for two years and must meet with the Center for Community Standards.

Additionally, the Sigma Chi fraternity is on social probation after an incident on January 31, where the front doors of the fraternity house were chained shut during a social event.

The University said this action prevented a safe exit, leading to charges of reckless endangerment. Sigma Chi is required to complete research, reflection, and a presentation on safety violations and undergo fire code and safety training with the Pullman Fire Department.

A new investigation is also underway involving the Phi Gamma Delta fraternity at WSU, with alleged violations of hazing, alcohol use, and physical harm. Further updates are expected as the investigation progresses.

N, Wash. – Washington State University has suspended the Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity for five lowing an investigation into hazing violations.

The investigation, which began on January 28, uncovered that new members were coerced into consuming alcohol and cannabis and subjected to harsh punishments, including cleaning duties and physical activities for poor performance on quizzes.

The hazing incidents spanned the last three fall semesters and the spring semester of the previous year.

The fraternity faced several charges, including hazing, physical harm, reckless endangerment, and alcohol and drug violations.
