MOTION TO STRIKE STATE'S MOTION TO DISMISS

I. <u>IDENTITY OF MOVING PARTY</u>

Petitioner, Robert Lough, answers the government's motion to modify this Court's order and to dismiss Mr. Lough's pro se petition.

II. STATEMENT OF RELIEF SOUGHT

Mr. Lough moves this Court to reject the government's motion to modify and to strike the government's motion to dismiss Mr. Lough's pro se petition.

III. GROUNDS FOR RELIEF SOUGHT

- 1. The Government's motion to modify should be rejected.
- a. This Court directed Mr. Lough to file the motion to combine the original and subsequent petitions, which Mr. Lough completed as directed.

- b. There was good cause for this request by the Court. Both the original and additional pro se petitions raise important issues which have not been reviewed by this Court previously. It is in the interest of justice that this Court should consider whether to take review of the issues raised.
- c. Allowing these issues to be considered by this Court for review does not create an additional burden upon the government or this Court. The government has declared it does not intend to file an argument against Mr. Lough's original petition. And while Mr. Lough's pro se petition adds an additional argument, this issue has also been fully litigated in the Court of Appeals.
- d. Providing Mr. Lough with the opportunity to have these issues heard is fair and comports with due process. This Court should find its original decision to be proper and deny the government's motion to modify.
 - 2. The government's motion to dismiss the pro se petition should be stricken.
- a. RAP 13.4(d) provides that the government has thirty days to respond to a petition for review.
- b. Mr. Lough filed his petition for review on November 7,2016.

- c. The government did not move to dismiss this petition until this Court had ordered the petitions to be combined, well past the time allowed to object to this filing.
- d. Because this request is untimely, this Court should strike the government's motion to dismiss Mr. Lough's pro se petition.

IV. CONCLUSION

Mr. Lough requests this Court affirm its prior ruling granting
Mr. Lough's motion for a combined over length petition.
