

Dear Ms. Lennon,

This letter serves to notify the Court that Douglas County stands by its previously filed Respondent's Brief submitted on March 14, 2018, and agrees with the Court of Appeals Opinion of December 11, 2018, which correctly found that the public has an interest in viewing potentially exempt materials where a polygraph showed numerous instances of theft and dishonesty by a law enforcement officer.

Furthermore, in his petition for review, Sheats asserts that the Court of Appeals erred by refusing to enjoin the polygraph results to "anyone" making a public disclosure request, and that the court further erred by permitting dissemination of an exempt record for "all" law enforcement personnel upon request.

The Court's discretionary review is not warranted. The Court of Appeals published decision is fact –specific to Sheats' circumstances, entirely consistent with settled Washington law, and establishes no precedent. Sheats provides no factually-based argument to support his contention that the issues in this case qualify as issues of substantial public interest requiring further guidance by this Court.

Accordingly, the Court should deny review.
