Cameras in Court: GR 16

Approach:

- 1. Presume Access
- 2. Give all a chance to be heard
- 3. Impose restrictions only if:
 - Based on a "compelling" reason
 - Drawn as narrowly as possible
 - Rooted in specific facts of case
- 4. Articulate your reasoning on record

Access to Court Documents: GR 15

Approach:

Precisely the same 4 steps!

Closed Hearing? (Bone Club)

Approach:

Same 4 steps!

General approach to press issues:

- Think first of the shared missions of the courts and the media (public education and participation);
- Stay mindful of the court's separate goals that should not be sacrificed (fairness, truthseeking, dignity); and
- Strive to best accommodate all interests to achieve the broadest public benefit.

GENERAL PRESS INTERVIEW TIPS FOR JUDGES

- 1. Develop relationships with reporters BEFORE being in the news.
- 2. Always return reporters' phone calls.
- 3. Be prepared for any interview. Think both about what you want to say and avoid.
- 4. Never say "no comment", explain why commenting would be inappropriate.
- 5. Don't go "off the record" unless you know and trust the reporter.
- 6. Think fast, talk slow.
