1. Special Executive Session 7:00 a.m. – 7:33 a.m. (Closed to Public)

2. Meeting Called to Order (Open to Public)

Judge Rachelle Anderson called the September 14, 2020 Certified Professional Guardianship Board meeting to order at 8:01 a.m.

3. Welcome, Roll-Call And Approval of Minutes

Roll was called and all present were welcomed. Judge Anderson introduced AOC's new Guardian Grievance Investigator, Rhonda Scott.

Motion A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of the August 10,

2020 Board meeting as written. The motion passed. Judge Blinn abstained.

4. Chair's Report

Judge Anderson reported that she and Kay King will be making webinar presentations on the Uniform Guardianship, Conservatorship, and Other Protective Arrangements Act (UGA) to Certified Professional Guardians at the Guardian Institute on September 28 and 29. Judge Anderson will present "A Guardianship Update for 2021 and Beyond", and Kay King will speak on "Transitions and Changes under the UGA". Judge Anderson also reported on the work of the Superior Court Guardianship and Probate Committee, jointly with the Family and Juvenile Law Section, focusing on Article 2 of the UGA and minor guardianships. This section of the UGA becomes effective January 1, 2021. Judge Lewis asked if there will be materials provided

regarding this transition to the courts in general. Staff answered there are two sessions currently scheduled, October 19 and November 2.

5. Grievance Report

Staff reported during the month of August, four new grievances were received, and five grievances were closed. Three grievances remain pending before the Conflict Review Committee. One grievance is in Hearing status. Of the fifty-two (52) total grievances received to date in 2020, twenty-nine (29) have been resolved. Forty-nine (49) grievances remain open requiring investigation. Thirty-one (31), or 63% of open grievances involve nine CPGs or CPG Agencies. A member of the Board commented that a chart included in the Board's meeting materials detailing guardian grievances disaggregated by year of CPG certification no longer seemed meaningful, due to the low number of CPGs involved. Another member of the Board asked Staff how many Professional Guardians who completed an intensive weekend program for certification prior to the UW certification program are still active. Staff will research and report back to the Board.

Before breaking into Executive Session, Judge Anderson opened the floor for any questions or comments from attending members of the public. Hearing none, Judge Anderson called the Open Session closed to the public at 8:16 a.m. and anticipated reconvening at 8:25 a.m. Members of the public were invited stand by in the Zoom Video Conference Waiting Room.

The Public Session reconvened at 8:48 a.m. There were no matters brought up for vote during the Executive Session discussion.



I am questioning the need for this rule change. All continuing education, whether with the Guardian Institute, WAPG or the NGA has been viral. The Guardian Institute is offering a hybrid in-person (if allowed by the county)/virtual conference in September. I'd be interested in the complaints that the CPGB has received. Are CPGs saying that their business has suffered? I can't speak for anyone else but Bridge Builders, Ltd only had a slight slowdown in March and April. Business has been picking up rapidly since then. GPGs are essential, so other than not being able to physically visit clients, not much has changed other than spending more phone time with facility staff checking up on clients as best we can. As to the cost of CE, the Guardian Institute offers partial scholarships to those who might be struggling. For our September conference, we have received only one application for a scholarship out of five available. Maybe there are concerned that I have not experienced but unless I know what they are, it's difficult to have any other opinion.
