#### 1. Meeting Called to Order

Judge Diana Kiesel called the March 13, 2023 Certified Professional Guardianship and Conservatorship Board meeting to order at 9:01 a.m..

#### 2. Welcome, Roll Call & Approval of Minutes

Judge Kiesel welcomed all present both in person and remotely.

Motion: It was moved and seconded to approve the March 13, 2023 Board meeting

#### 3. Chair's Report

Judge Kiesel reflected on her time with the Board and thanked members for their hard work under the UGA.

#### 4. Public Comment Period

Several members of the public presented.

Ms. Deborah Jameson requested that the Board reduce bias in applications by removing SPI and opening the application review to public session.

Mr. Chris Neil presented on the history of the Board.

Ms. Karen Newland shared how the best part of guardianship is the joy and wants to bring personal stories to the Board periodically.

Ms. Linda Voller presented the need for CPGC support in the unsheltered population.

#### 5. Regulations

Mr. Smerken announced that the regulations committee has reinterpreted the bylaws to understand that committees need not abstain from votes on their activities.

#### 6. Education

Ms. Vass presented recent webinars for approval. It was moved and seconded that the board approve the CEUs recommended. The motion passed.

#### 7. Annual report

Ms. Scott presented the annual report for 2022.

#### 8. Grievance Report

Ms. Scott reported five (5) grievances were received during the month of March. At March's meeting, the Board dismissed two (2) grievances and forwarded five (5) grievances to superior court. A total forty-one (41) grievances are currently unresolved. Currently, there are two hundred fifty-two (252) active CPGCs.

#### 9. Presentation by Office of Public Guardianship

Ms. Thai Kien presented on the Office of Public Guardianship (OPG). Ms. Karina Tharge discussed the challenges of being a guardian and how OPG helps to alleviate some of those challenges. Ms. Kien discussed the increasing demands for guardianship services and the shortage of professional guardians. In an effort to recruit more CPGCs and reduce barriers for applicants, Ms. Kien suggested the Board consider a marketing component, reduce the number of years' experience required for those with a high school diploma and an associate's degree, and reexamine regulations to allow experience as a lay guardian for a family member to count as transferrable. This presentation was offered as one (1) General CEU.

Ms. Kien also provided clarification on the Board's relationship with OPG stating that the Board does not have oversight of the OPG program.
