








## **HB1227** Monitoring and Evaluation Project

### **Purpose**

- Determine whether HB1227 is being implemented as intended
- Identify successful strategies and challenges encountered during implementation
- Determine whether HB1227 is achieving the intended outcomes



Surveys with dependency partners



## **Data Collection Design**



#### **Research Activities**

#### April – May 2023

- Affiliation Agreement between the AOC and UW School of Public Health
- Review of relevant written documentation related to the HB1227 shelter hearing process
- Interviews with key dependency partners to explore their expectations about upcoming changes
- Interview about the HB1227 and its origin with Rep. Tana Senn
- HB1227 Data workgroup
- Collaboration with the Capacity Building Center for Courts (CBCC) and JCAMP CoP

#### June 2023

- Identified the measures to include into the tool
- Formatted a tool to fit into 3 pages
- Feedback from CBCC, the data workgroup, DCYF, OPD, AG, and P4P
- Designed a codebook to ensure accurate data collection
- Identified FJCIP courts for testing:
  - King
  - Pierce
  - Clark
  - Spokane
  - Clallam

#### July – September 2023

- Train observers
- Testing the tool (multiple hearings observed to ensure reliability)
- Establishing the tool's ability to be used for real data collection
- Solicitation of feedback from observers regarding the tool's usability
- · Refinement of the instrument
- Writing an overview of the court observation tool development process, documenting the steps taken during its creation and testing



### **Next Steps**

#### In September, 2023

- Recruit student observers and provide them with appropriate training
- Establish an MOU and/or DSA with each participating court to access the data
- Request case files and court recordings to be sent to us
- Secure court clerk assistance in retrieving hearings and case files
- No personal or identifying information about parents or children will be collected



#### How will we Share the Data

**Anonymization**: All personally identifiable information will be removed (including Judges' names or counties)

**Report:** The report will be shared with the courts. This may involve arranging meetings or presentations to discuss the findings, answer questions, and provide clarifications

**Collaborative Discussion**: The judges will have the opportunity to review and discuss the report, sharing their insights and perspectives

**Action Planning**: Based on the discussions and feedback received from the courts, action plans can be developed to implement recommended changes or improvements. These action plans may include targeted training programs, practice adjustments, or other initiatives aimed at enhancing court procedures, fairness, and access to justice
