II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

The engrossed house bill clarifies the language that would be amended in RCW 46.63.170(1). There is no change to the judicial impact.

The original bill would amend RCW 46.63.170(1) to read: (i) A flashing yellow beacon and a sign reading "CAMERA ACTIVE WHEN FLASHING" must be placed in locations where school speed zones are enforced by automated traffic safety cameras. A beacon required under this subsection (1)(i) must flash only when an automated traffic safety camera is being used and not at any other time.

This amendment is not expected to cause any additional workload to AOC or to the courts.
