Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

This bill provides definitions and rules for the capture, use, storage, and destruction of biometric identifiers.

Section 1 would add a new section to the Consumer Protection Act providing definitions and rules for the capture, use, storage, and destruction of biometric identifiers.

Section 2 of the bill would limit recovery of costs and reasonable attorneys fees to the Office of the Attorney General if the enforcement action is brought by the Attorney General under Section 1 of the act.

None are expected.

II. C - Expenditures

There may be small impacts on the courts for hearing cases filed by the Attorney General under the bill. The complexity and frequency of any cases is not known.

The Office of the Attorney General does not expect many investigations or cases. Investigations will not always lead to court cases.
