## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

### **II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts**

This bill provides definitions and rules for the capture, use, storage, and destruction of biometric identifiers .

Section 1 would add a new section to the Consumer Protection Act providing definitions and rules for the capture, use, storage, and destruction of biometric identifiers.

Section 2 of the bill would limit recovery of costs and reasonable attorneys fees to the Office of the Attorney General if the enforcement action is brought by the Attorney General under Section 1 of the act.

### **II. C - Expenditures**

There may be small impacts on the courts for hearing cases filed by the Attorney General under the bill . The complexity and frequency of any cases is not known.

The Office of the Attorney General does not expect many investigations or cases . Investigations will not always lead to court cases.

Any court costs associated with this are indeterminate but expected to be well below \$50,000 for court time and support staff time.
