Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

The original bill stated: A section would be added to RCW 9.68A that would add a one thousand dollar fee for each depiction or image of visual or printed matter that constitutes a separate conviction when a person is convicted of violating RCW 9.68A.070. The fees would be collected by the clerk of the court and remitted to the state treasurer for deposit into the internet crimes against children account created in section 3 of the act.

A new section would be added to RCW 9.68A that would create an internet crimes against children account that would be administered by the attorney general. Twenty-five percent of receipts to this account would be used for grants to organizations providing mental health services to victims of child sexual abuse.

There would not be any impact to the courts and the time needed to modify the judicial information system would be minimal.

The only change to the bill is in the section added to RCW 9.68A. Twenty-five percent of receipts to the new account would be used for grants to child advocacy centers.
