The bill would amend RCW 9.73.260 to add a definition of "cell site simulator device" to the statute and include such devices in the list of similar communication monitoring equipment subject to court review and statutory regulation.

There are small potential expenditure impacts for court hearings to review law enforcement requests for use of cell site simulator devices. These hearings are expected to take the same amount of time as reviews of requests for use of the other technologies described in existing statute (pen register, trap or trace device). For purposes of this note it is assumed that such review would require 15 minutes of judicial officer time. It would require over 350 such reviews to exceed \$50,000 in expenditure impact.
