II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

There is no change to Section 109(3) between SHB 1541 and PSHB 1541. However, SHB 1541 adds amendments in Sections 110, 703, and 704.

Section 110 amends RCW 13.50.010 to change "Washington state center for court research" to administrative office of the courts and allows data contained in the electronic research copy of all records in the judicial information system related to juveniles to be shared with othere governmental agencies. This amendment would not have any fiscal impact.

The amendments in Sections 703 and 704 do not pertain to AOC or the courts and therefore have no additional impact .

Original Bill:

This bill would implement strategies to close the educational opportunity gap, based on the recommendations of the educational opportunity gap oversight and accountability committee.

Section 109(3) would require the education data center to develop data-sharing and research agreements with the administrative office of the courts to conduct research on educational and workforce outcomes using data maintained under RCW 13.50.010(12) related to juveniles.

Administrative Office of the Courts already enters in to data-sharing and research agreements with many organizations. This work is considered "usual and customary" and would not require any additional resources.
