Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

This bill would add a new section to RCW 9A.44 to create the crime of criminal invasion of privacy via nonconsensual disclosure or dissemination of a sexual act or intimate parts.

Section (1)(7) would make criminal invasion of privacy a class C felony.

II. B - Cash Receipts Impact

It is not known how many convictions of this crime there would be per year and there is no judicial information system data available to estimate how much additional revenue this new felony would result in.

The maximum penalty for a class C felony is \$10,000. For illustrative purposes, there would need to be more than 5 felony convictions in the amount of \$10,000 to exceed \$50,000 in annual court revenues. This is based on the maximum felony penalty amount being ordered and paid.

It is assumed the cash receipt impact would be greater than zero but less than \$50,000 per year.

II. C - Expenditures

There is no judicial information system data available to estimate how many new hearings or trials this bill would result in . However, it is expected that the impact would be less than \$50,000 per year.
