## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

### **II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts**

This bill would allow the prosecuting attorney to file a special allegation of a nefarious drone enterprise where a drone is used by the accused or an accomplice to commit or facilitate the commission of any crime. Twelve months would be added to the standard sentence range for the underlying offense where the special allegation is pled and proved beyond a reasonable doubt.
