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Part II: Narrative Explanation

II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

The proposed amended substitute bill does not change the impact to the courts or AOC.

Original Bill:

A new section would be added to RCW 9A.40 that would allow a court to determine the necessity of imposing a no-contact order when a defendant has been charged by citation, complaint or information with an offense involving trafficking under RCW 9A.40.100.

A new section would be added to RCW 9A.88 that would allow a court to determine the necessity of imposing a no-contact order when a defendant has been charged by citation, complaint or information with an offense involving trafficking under RCW 9A.88.070 and RCW 9A.88.080.

There have been an average of 128 orders per year that this legislation would affect. Per information from staff, only 5-10 minutes would be added to each arraignment. Therefore, the judicial impact is minimal.
