## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would allow a coroner to order persons who are at the scene of a death to vacate the scene until the coroner has completed their duties. Failure to comply with the coroner's order to vacate the scene of a death would be a misdemeanor.

### **Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts**

Section 1 – Would add a new section to RCW 36.24, authorizing a coroner at the scene of a death under investigation to order a person to vacate the scene until such a time that the coroner has completed their duties at the scene. Failure to comply with the coroner's order to vacate the scene would be a misdemeanor.

No data exists to estimate the number of misdemeanors that would be charged as a result of this bill.
