#### **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would add new statutes and amend existing statutes pertaining to the use of deadly force by law enforcement officers.

# Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

This bill would:

- Change the criminal liability standards for law enforcement officers using deadly force;
- Require investigations of deadly force incidents involving law enforcement officers;
- Require collection and reporting of data related to deadly force incidents involving law enforcement officers;
- Expand racial profiling statutes to address racial biases;
- Require a work group to develop policies for law enforcement agencies to create independent civilian oversight of law enforcement accountability;
- Require the Criminal Justice Training Commission (CJTC) to update training for law enforcement and corrections officers;
- Create the "Criminal Justice Training Account", subject to appropriation by the legislature, and allowing for grants, federal funds, donations, and private gifts.
