This bill amends RCW 9.91.170 to include service animals in training as a part of the definition of "service animal" and "guide dog". Amending this RCW's definition will expand the scope of penalties for interfering with the use of a service animal or guide dog to include service animals and guide dogs still in training.

AOC has reviewed the past three years of case filings under RCW 9.91.170 and found that only one case has been filed in that time frame. This bill will have no fiscal impact to the courts.
