## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would create the Community Review Board within the Office of the Governor. The board would be required to review incarcerated offenders for possible early release after twenty years of confinement.

The bill would authorize an offender who has been convicted of and incarcerated for one or more crimes to petition the Community Review Board for early release after having served at least twenty years of total confinement.

The bill would require the Governor to review each decision of the Community Review Board to approve or deny a petition for release.

The bill would require the Sentencing Guidelines Commission to contract for the services of an external consultant to evaluate the state's sentencing laws and practices.
