# Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would amend RCW 10.01.100 to increase fines for crimes committed by corporations.

The bill would impose on a corporation for any criminal offense for which no special corporate fine is specified, a fine not to exceed:

- a) \$1,000,000 for a class A or class B felony (current statutory fine is \$10,000);
- b) \$750,000 for a class C felony (current statutory fine is \$10,000);
- c) \$250,000 for a gross misdemeanor (current statutory fine is \$1,000); and
- d) \$50,000 for a misdemeanor (current statutory fine is \$500).

# Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 1(1) – Would provide for the imposition of fines on a corporation for any criminal offense for which no special corporate fine is specified. The maximum fines would be:

- a) \$1,000,000 for a class A or class B felony;
- b) \$750,000 for a class C felony;
- c) \$250,000 for a gross misdemeanor; and
- d) \$50,000 for a misdemeanor.

Section 1(2) – Would provide that if a special fine for a corporation is expressly specified in the statute that defines an offense, the fine that is imposed must be within the limits specified in the statute.

## II.B - Cash Receipt Impact

Indeterminate. While this bill would significantly increase fines, there is no data to estimate the number of fines that would be imposed. Fines are not always imposed at the maximum amount, are not always collected in full, and fines sometimes take years to collect.

### II.C – Expenditures
