Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would:

- 1) Provide for interim attorney fees and costs during any action, suit, or judicial review if a government agency knowingly acts contrary to law;
- 2) Provide a non-government party to move for interim attorney's fees;
- 3) Require the non-government party to bear the burden of proof beyond a reasonable doubt that the government party knowingly acted contrary to law;
- 4) Provide for the award of interim attorney's fees and costs in an amount adequate to pay the non-government party's claims.

Government party is defined as the state and all state agencies, cities, counties, special districts, municipal incorporations, and their agencies.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

This bill would amend RCW 4.84.010, regarding payment of attorneys' fees in court cases, to provide that a nongovernment party in action against a government party, when there is an allegation that the government party has knowingly acted contrary to law, can move for interim attorney's fees, which must be heard and decided before other proceedings; if the allegation is proven, the court shall order the government party to pay costs & fees adequate to finance the claim.

II.C – Expenditures

This bill could increase court time due to the additional hearing requirements. No data exists to base an estimate for the number of cases this could affect, but impact is expected to be minimal.
