## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would amend RCW 38.52.180, pertaining to immunity from liability for emergency response volunteers, to include members of professional or trade associations.

### **Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts**

No fiscal impact to the state, since this bill adds "professional or trade associations" to those immunized from liability under RCW 38.52.180(3) for acts committed by covered volunteers during covered activities. The state is included on the list of those entities immune to liability for covered actions.
