II. A - Brief Description Of What The Measure Does That Has Fiscal Impact on the Courts

RCW 28A.225.090 would be amended to state that if a child fails to comply with a court order for truancy or if the child continues to be truant after entering into a court-approved order with the truancy board, the court may impose sanctions that do not include detention, such as community restitution. The RCW previously allowed a child to be given detention to be serviced at a secure crisis residential center or a juvenile detention facility for up to seven days. That section is stricken.
