Part II: Narrative Explanation

This bill would require an individual who is charged with committing sexually violent crimes or criminal offenses with a substantial link to sexual violence to pay a fee upon the commission of the crime.

The bill would create the Washington Sexually Oriented Crime Fee Account.

Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts

Section 2 – Would create a fee that would be levied and collected upon the commission of a crime of sexual violence or crimes with a substantial nexus to sexual offenses. The fee would be paid by the individual charged with committing the crimes.

Section 3 – The fees required to be collected by the offender under Section 2 would be deemed to be held in trust by the court until paid to the Department of Revenue.

Section 4 – Would create the Washington Sexually Oriented Crime Fee Account.

II.B - Cash Receipt Impact

Indeterminate. The Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) does not have data to estimate how many persons would collect the required fee upon commission of a sexually oriented crime.
