## **Part II: Narrative Explanation**

This bill would prohibit a person from wearing a mask, hood, or device where any portion of the face of the person is covered in order to conceal the identity of the wearer. This prohibition would apply when:

- Entering or remaining upon a walk, alley, street, road, highway, or other thoroughfare dedicated to public use;
- Entering or remaining in a trading area, concourse, waiting room, lobby, or foyer open to, used by, or frequented by the general public;
- Entering or remaining upon or within the grounds or buildings owned, leased, maintained, or operated by the state or a political subdivision;
- Attending or participating in a meeting on private property of another unless written permission for the meeting has first been obtained from the owner or occupant.

### **Part II.A – Brief Description of what the Measure does that has fiscal impact on the Courts**

Section 2 would create a new gross misdemeanor for wearing a mask or hood in public with certain exceptions.

Note: Section 3 of this bill includes an effective date of July 1, 2017. The Administrative Office of the Courts assumes a later (yet to be determined) implementation date.

### **II.C – Expenditures**

No data exists to estimate the number of new gross misdemeanors that would be filed resulting from this bill. Court impact would be minimal.

The law tables and other minor information technology system updates would be required. This could be managed within existing resources.
